Security; Covering the parking lot.

DTH we have a large blind spot, the Southwest side of the campus. We are talking about cameras to cover that. And I would like to see a locking gun rack, maybe biometric with key back up.

UTH, I fought keeping the shades open for years when I was up there. The time I was there a few weeks ago, the shades were all closed. I would recommend you figure out how to protect the parking lot. Why?

Review Reagan video, 30 seconds. Incident lasted 1.4 seconds, semi auto, fired 6 rounds, 4 people hit, Secret Service didn't get their weapons out.

ISIS shooting in Turkey, Catholic church. Lasted a few seconds, one person assassinated. Most worshipers didn't see until over.

Kansas City shooting, 1.9 seconds, 1 killed, 24 injured, 850 cops in vicinity. Two Juveniles.

San Bernardino massacre, 2 people fired 100 rounds in 2 minutes.

An AR fires 13 rounds a second on full auto. Two perps could fire approximately 54 rounds in the 2 seconds it will take you to react, let alone get your weapon in the game. Unless the blinds were destroyed in the initial onslaught, you wouldn't even be able to see the shooters. And to reach the front door you would be going across the line of fire, another 2 seconds. So conceivably, 150 rounds fired before you could return fire. And hand to hand engagement would be futile, in the first 4-6 seconds.

We can't do everything, but Keith Graves of Christian Warrior Training, always emphasizes the importance of covering the parking lot. When Joe and his friends were up here helping us with training, 1 long gun was posted in the High School youth room, and one on the roof.
